On Sunday, November 8, 2020, Christina Marie Haynes, beloved daughter, loving mother of two children, and dear friend to many, passed away at the age of 42 due to complications from metastatic breast cancer.

Chrissy was born on April 7, 1978 at Cafritz Hospital in Washington, DC. She resided in Maryland and was a graduate of La Plata High School in 1996. She proceeded to become a corrections officer for the Charles County Sheriff's Department, Bailiff at the Charles County Court House, and Security for Kohl's Department Stores. Chrissy also had a knack for getting things done and went on to manage the Hughesville, Charlotte Hall, and Waldorf-White Plains Jazzercise franchise. She was a hard-working mom who raised two beautiful children, Brynn and Blake (father – Michael Williams).

Chrissy was a sports enthusiast and athlete for most of her life. She grew up playing many sports to include basketball, softball, and golf. She did not just play but excelled as a pitcher in fast pitch softball and the only female, on an all-male team, to outclass many of her male counterparts in golf. Chrissy enjoyed attending baseball games and always kept up with her favorite football teams, Tennessee and The Washington Redskins. Chrissy was not only capable of besting the boys in sports but was also a contender as Miss Teen Maryland and won the title of Miss Maryland Teen Hostess. She was strong, athletic, and beautiful. Another favorite hobby of Chrissy's was singing. Everywhere she went people encouraged her and loved to hear her sing. She really was a woman of many talents. Chrissy was also a collector...collector of many things furry. She loved boxers most, but any type of dog would do and even a bird here or there. Chrissy wanted to save them all and would love even the most difficult ones and they all loved her back. Chrissy was known for being tough when the situation needed her to be, loyal to her friends, and loving to her family. She was a wonderful mother, cherished daughter, devoted sister, and always the favorite aunt to her nieces and nephews.

Chrissy was preceded in death by her sister and best friend, Billie Jo Dunn; grandfathers, James D. Haynes and George C. McGuigan II; and grandmother, Peggy F. McGuigan.


