Richard Lynn Springer, 75, of Hughesville, Maryland, died peacefully at home on February 1, 2020.

Born November 6, 1944 in Montgomery, Alabama, he is survived by his wife of 53 years, Rita; his children Robert (Jill), Bethany (Michael), Andrew (Catherine); his sister Ann Kinney; six grandchildren.

He graduated from the Ohio State University with a degree of Doctor of Veterinary Medicine in 1969, and served two years in the U. S. Army Veterinary Corps.
