Sandra Blaine Richardson (Sandy), of La Plata, MD passed away on February 11, 2022 at the age of 79, at home surrounded by her children.

Sandy was born on February 15, 1942 in St. Johnsbury, Vermont to Dudley Alberton and Jeannie Mae Blaine. She was preceded in death by her beloved husband of almost 50 years (John L. Richardson, Jr.), her parents and her only sister (Martha Carlson).

She began her early years on her parent's dairy farm in West Barnet, Vermont and showed their cows at various fairs. She was a lifeguard and taught swimming lessons at Harvey's Lake in West Barnet, Vermont.

She also coached various sports with the Boys and Girls Club in the communities where she lived. She cherished moments cheering on her children, grandchildren and great grandchildren at their many activities and sports. She treasured the many adventures with lifelong friends, Lonnie and Tina Dunbar, greatly. She was a diehard Washington Capitals fan.

She was a great role model of unconditional love and support. She was humble and kind with a strong will and her generosity was unmatched. She always put the needs of others before herself and was always willing to lend a helping hand.

She is survived by her four children: Butch, Kim, Janette and Cathy; five grandchildren (Kristen, Holly, Christopher, Morgan and Erik); four great grandchildren (Allen, Ryelynn, Damian and Irie); her beloved cousins Cindy (Bill Simpson) and Jean (Bill Rieken); and many other extended family and friends (too many to list).
