Allan W. "Sonny" Hopkins, 83 of White Plains, Maryland, died June 19, 2016.

Sonny was a retired major with the United States Air Force, having served from 1953-1974. Following his Air Force retirement, he worked for the U. S. Census Bureau for 20 years.
