Bruce "Nance" Blake, 73, of Annapolis, MD died on February 6, 2021 at Charlotte Hall Veterans Home, Charlotte Hall, MD.

Nance was a 1st Lieutenant in the United States Army, Intelligence and served during the Vietnam era. He was an alum and long-time supporter of Virginia Tech.
