“ *I am saddened to find this obituary. For years I had been looking forward to reconnecting with Coach Carlos Silva but was unsuccessful. We lost touch in 1993.*

I met Coach Silva in May of 1990 in DC when I was on trials with the Washington Diplomats at Georgetown University. I was new to the USA as a recent high school graduate from Spain. I was broke, spoke no English, and was not particularly happy with my tryout performance that day. He approached me in Spanish so we chatted for a while. Then out of the blue, he says to me he could offer me a chance to go to college and play soccer if I worked hard on improving my English skills before the fall of 1990. I thought he was joking. He was dead serious.

That conversation with Coach Silva changed the path of my life and I will forever be in debt with him. I just wish I could say thanks to him in person for seeing potential in me as a kid. He was a great coach, friend, and mentor.

My apologies to his family for sharing this memory so late.

There was nothing he couldn't fix with a hammer and destroyed everything else in the process. I remember the boat he had. We had just finished repairing it. We launched somewhere by his house.

The boat was running great and we had to idle it out of the little cove. There were snakes everywhere in the water that day and we were making fun of each other about how we would throw the other into the water with the snakes. Next thing I knew, a snake jumped into the boat and Carlos screamed like crazy, tearing the boat apart looking for something to kill it with. I started to flip out because I lost sight of the snake and Carlos kept banging into me. Carlos found a plastic oar and started hitting the snake and me in the process. The whole time he screamed "God Dam God Dam!" over and over again. Not sure who won that flight, Carlos or the snake. I think the snake got tired of being thrown in the air from the oar. Eventually, it jumped out of the boat. I looked at Carlos and said I am done boating. He agreed. I don't think the boat ever made it back in the water after that and he sold it.

The last couple of times I saw him, he was not well. He could get me to where he wanted to go but could not get us back to the house. He would sometimes just start talking Spanish for no reason. Carlos and I share the same birthday - February 9th - and always called each other on that day. I am glad to have had his friendship and will always remember him.

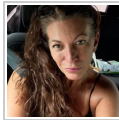
You are so right, I only wish I had \$1000.00 because that's what it would have cost me to put half of the things I & others loved about my father in his obituary. Thank you for your kind words
