Donald James “Don” MacMillan, age 58, of La Plata, Maryland, passed away on February 9, 2021 at MedStar Georgetown University Hospital in Washington, D.C.

Don was born on December 2, 1962 in Winchester, Massachusetts to the late George Donald MacMillan and the late Ann Theresa Nowell MacMillan.

Don was a Veteran of the United States Army and a National Guardsman, retiring after having served more than 21 years in the Virginia National Guard. He also worked as an Internet Technology Manager for Policy and Planning for the Internal Revenue Service for 36 years. Don was a beautiful human being with a wicked sense of humor. He enjoyed the simple things in life: a good book, a good meal and making those he loved laugh.

He is survived by his loving wife, Stacey Crawford MacMillan; one son, Michael MacMillan; one daughter, Lauren MacMillan; nine siblings, Ann Marie Taylor (David), Nancy Laurino (Joe), Carol MacMillan, Janet MacMillan, William MacMillan (Silva), David MacMillan, Roy MacMillan (Dawn), Shauna MacMillan, and Alicia MacMillan; and one sister-in-law, Jessica Crawford.

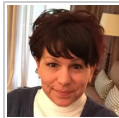
