



## Edgar William Wiesert

Edgar “Ed” William Wiesert, (92) of La Plata MD died on September 3, 2024 at University of Maryland Charles Regional Medical Center.

Born on December 26, 1931 in Seattle Washington. He was the son of the late Edgar J. Wiesert and Virginia Ann Wiesert (Maiden name Ottinger). Ed was the middle child of three, he had two sisters Marilyn McHugh of Sebastopol California and Virginia Boivin of Lynnwood Washington, two daughters, Carmen Slater and Pamela Wiesert of La Plata, MD and two sons, Dean of Myrtle Beach SC and Dale of La Plata MD and nine grandchildren.

Ed was an aviation enthusiast earning his private pilots license in 1971. Owning, operating and helping to maintain his aircraft for many years was one of his passions. He was a member of the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association.
