



Gary Wayne Dickinson

September 22, 1950 - January 26, 2024

Gary Wayne Dickinson, 73, of Waldorf passed away at his residence on January 26, 2024 of hydrocephalus. Gary was born on Sep 22, 1950 at Providence Hospital in Washington, DC, the youngest son of Harold Woodrow Dickinson and Margaret Ward DeShazo. Gary grew up in Hillcrest Heights, MD, in a house built by his father. He grew up surrounded by family, including his brother, the late Harold Dickinson Jr, and aunts, uncles, and cousins, some of whom were his neighbors. As a child, Gary took regular trips to King George County, VA, to visit extended family there. Gary was baptized at Hillcrest Baptist Church, where his family were active members.

After graduating High School in 1968, Gary began general studies at Prince Georges Community College. On Jun 14, 1969, he met Patricia Anne Tolson at a carnival in Clinton, MD, whom he married on July 31, 1971 at Hillcrest Baptist Church.

Gary served seven years in the Air Force, from Jan 20, 1971 until his honorable discharge on Feb 27, 1978. During this period, Gary and Pat had two children: the late Julie Dickinson Bradbury (Steven) and Paul Dickinson. Gary worked for the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) in Radar Maintenance between 1978 and 1990, where after he worked for the FAA as Program Manager until his retirement in 2011, for a total of 40 years of Military and Government Service.

Gary was an active member at First Baptist Church of Waldorf, where he served in the Sunday School, Youth, and Sound Ministries, as well as other areas.

Gary delighted in his grandchildren, Luke, Kara, and Jenna Bradbury, and enjoyed many camping and beach trips with them in his retirement years.

Gary leaves behind a wife, son, son-in-law, and three grandchildren. He was beloved by many, and will be greatly missed.
