George Timothy Estevez, lovingly known as Timmy, was born August 1, 1983 to Tim and Mary Beth McGlynn-Estevez. He grew up on a farm in Waldorf, MD where he enjoyed exploring the outdoors and playing with his sister and many cousins. He loved riding bikes, go-carts, playing in the “woods” and swimming. Timmy was a handsome and curious boy who loved adventures and got along with everyone. He was an exceptional Lego builder and had childhood dreams of becoming an architect.

Timmy graduated from Westlake High School in 2001. During high school, Tim worked at Chick-fil-A and developed many positive customer services and business skills. Tim was president of the Build a Dream Foundation in high school. This group helped build homes for people every two years. At that time, Tim still wanted to explore a career as an architect. He studied drafting and worked with R. L. Litten Associates Architects in La Plata, MD for a brief time. After a short time, Tim knew that wasn't the field for him and he started his esteemed banking career at the Bank of Southern Maryland, as a teller. Through his dedication and hard work, he was successfully promoted to various other positions within other banks including head teller, assistant manager, and branch manager. In addition to the Bank of Southern Maryland, his career led him to work at Old Line Bank, PNC and Community Bank of the Chesapeake. He earned his Bachelor of Science Degree in Management Studies from the University of Maryland University College in 2015. In 2016,
