George Austin Stewart of LaPlata, MD, passed away Friday, August 25, 2017 at Bridge Point Hospital in Washington, DC. He was 95 years old. He was born on March 5, 1922 in Washington, DC to the late Clara Alice (Brown) and Samuel Elmer Stewart. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife and mother to his children, Gertrude Katherine Stewart in December 1989.

He served in the U.S. Army/Airforce during World War II and then worked for the U.S. Government for over 30 years. 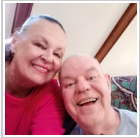
