“*My father taught me one of life's most valuable lessons. One day, during a normal family spat, I said to my father, "Why did you ever have children? You don't love me so I don't understand why you even brought me into the world." I spoke these words to my father...meaning every bit of what I said. My father, in his early years did not say, 'I love you.' He was not affectionate; he never attended my softball games or congratulated me on a job well done.*

But during this father-daughter spat--when I accused him of not loving me--he looked at me in utter astonishment. He removed his glasses and as calmly as he could...trying hard to suppress his genuine hurt, said to me, "How can you say such a thing to me? That I don't love you? I have spent every day since your mother and I began a family--getting up and going to work. I worked overtime, nights, shift work and whatever else was required of me as a father and a husband to provide for my family. Every week I brought my paycheck home and deposited it in your mother's hand so that she could clothe and feed you and make a mortgage payment to keep a roof over your head; to ensure that you and your brothers and sister had a stable place to call home. I received an allowance from my paycheck and left all other money in your mother's hands to be sure my children were taken care of, had shoes for school, money for field trips, decent and sanitary clothing. How can you POSSIBLY stand there and say I dont love you?"

And, he was right. He made many sacrifices for his family. I realized at that moment that just because someone doesn't show love the way I do or the way I think or want them to, doesn't mean that they DON'T love me.

Thank you Dad for teaching me such a valuable life lesson.... And most of all Dad, thank you for loving me!
