Joseph Avon Butler of Levittown, Pennsylvania (formerly of Waldorf, MD) was born May 5, 1948 in Randleman, North Carolina and departed this life on July 10, 2008. He was the son of the late Thomas and Maude Parsons Butler. He was one of seven children and was preceded in death by his sister, Linda Thompson, and two brothers, Thomas Butler, Jr. and William L.
