Joseph Michael "Joe" Wojewski of Waldorf, Maryland, died on Saturday, March 16, 2013 at Seasons Hospice in Randallstown, MD. He was 62 years old.

Born on July 1, 1950 in Newark, New Jersey, Joe was the son of the late Sally Delmonico and the late John Michael Wojewski. He grew up in Hazlet, NJ until he joined the U. S. Air Force. He was Honorably Discharged in 1974 at the rank of Sergeant. Joe was currently working for the U. S. Post Office Headquarters in Washington, DC as a Program Manager. He enjoyed bowling, especially in leagues, and even served as secretary for the Mixed League and the TGIF League. Joe also wrote the weekly newsletter for the bowling league. He loved music, reading, writing short stories and spending time with his family, especially his grandchildren.
