Lila Charlotte Knack, 91, of Bryantown, Maryland, passed away on Monday, November 18, 2024 at her home.

Born on November 21, 1932 in Bear Creek, Wisconsin, she was the daughter of the late Paul Schneidewend and Ella Schneidewend. After having grown up in Wisconsin, in 1952 Lila married her husband Robert (Bob) Knack in Pensacola, Florida where they resided for two years. As a military wife she resided in Florida, Spain, Virginia, and Maryland. Lila was a long-time cashier for A&P as well as Giant Food, respectively, before retiring in the early 1990s. After retirement Lila and Bob loved returning to Wisconsin during the Spring and Summer months to their cozy lake front home in Gresham, Wisconsin.

In addition to her parents, Lila was also preceded in death by her husband of 59 years, Robert L. Knack; her daughter Diana L. Knack; son Robert D. Knack; as well as her 12 siblings.
