Lynn Willoughby Headley, 86, of La Plata, MD, died on February 8, 2020 at Genesis La Plata Center.

Lynn was born on July 10, 1933 in Willard, OH to the late A. Gordon and Shirley (Pedicord) Willoughby. Lynn was married to Vernon Charles Headley in 1952. They were married for 62 years before his death in 2014

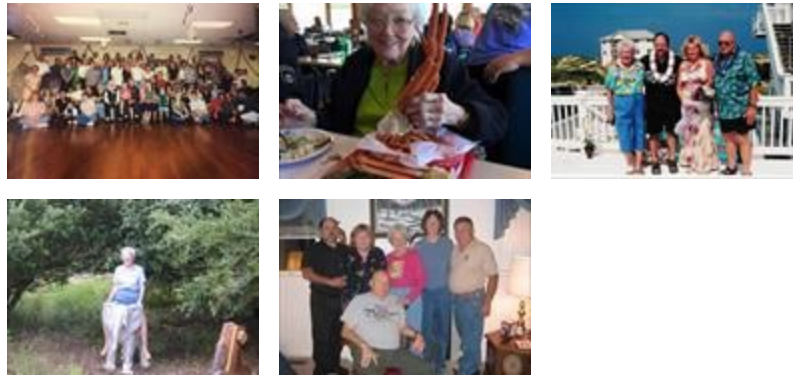

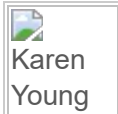

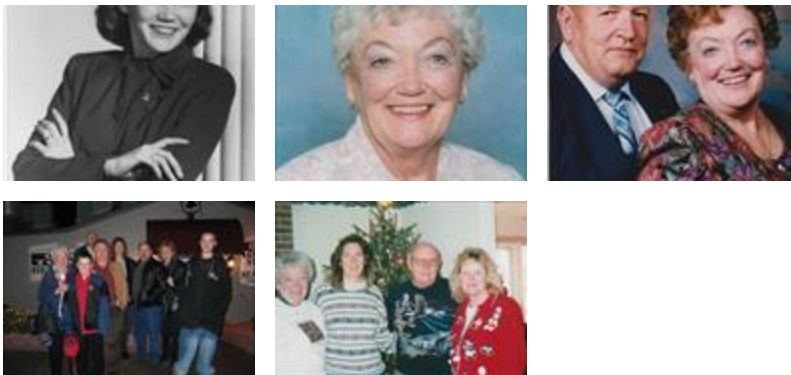
