November 6, 1940 - March 23, 2014

Patty Lou Woodall of Waldorf, MD died on March 23, 2014 at the University of MD Charles Regional Medical Center in La Plata, MD. She was 73 years old.

Patty was an administrative assistant with the Secretary of Agriculture in Washington, DC for over 30 years. She was a 1958 graduate of the University High School in Morgantown, WV.
