Raymond G. Bourassa, 97, formerly of White Plains, MD, died April 23, 2021 at The Charleston Senior Community in Waldorf, MD.

Raymond was born on February 22, 1924 in Worcester, MA, to Blanche (Hickey) and Anthony Bourassa. After 22 years of military service (Coast Guard and Navy) with time spent in the Pacific Theater during World War II, and 20 years of federal government service, he retired in 1984. He was a resident of Charles County since 1978.

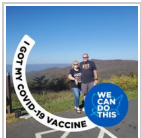
