November 30, 1967 - May 19, 2015

René Dimanche Jr., 47 of Waldorf, MD (previously of St. Louis, MO) died on May 19, 2015 in Laurel, MD. René was born November 30, 1967 in Port au Prince, Haiti to Rene Dimanche and the late Colette Bistoury.

He was the director and planner for Urban Canvas Artist Network in St. Louis, MO. He was a Veteran of the United States Army, serving as an E-5/Sgt. at Fort Hood, TX from June 1992 - June 1996. His educational background consisted of Rhode Island School of Design, Providence, RI, Bachelor of Architect from Webster University, St. Louis, MO, Master of Business Administration Fontbonne University, St. Louis, MO, Master of Fine Arts Regional Arts Commission, St. Louis, MO, and Community Artist Training. He was of the Christian faith and was a member of Healing Place Church in Waldorf, MD.

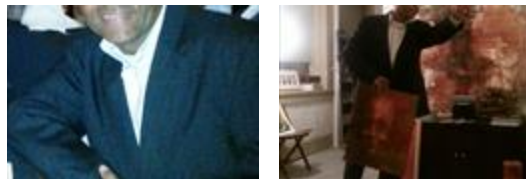
