Richard "Dickie" Estevez, was born May 7, 1943 and passed away December 10, 2020 at Charles Regional Medical Center.

In 1966, Dickie opened Clinton Iron Works with his brother-in-law Alfred Gregory. Then in 1972 opened Universal Metal Products Inc. which included longtime friend, Richard "Dick" Douth.

When not working, he enjoyed spending his free time with his family, friends and at the racetrack, which was the 2nd love of his life. Dickie is fondly known as "Daddy Warbucks." He was happiest when he had the opportunity to race the "Daddy Warbucks Racecar" a 1965 Ford Falcon among other racecars owned throughout his life. Dickie was inducted into the Hall of Fame at Maryland International Raceway in 2010 and has received numerous other racing awards through the years.
