



Robert "Bob" Martin Schaumburg

July 25, 1932 - April 7, 2014

Robert Martin Schaumburg of Swan Point, MD died on April 7, 2014 at the Southern MD Hospital Center in Clinton, MD. He was 81 years old.

Bob lived in Brooklyn, New York City until the age of 13 when his family moved to Charles County, a place "where they don't know what a decent corned beef sandwich is". Bob graduated from Sacred Heart School and the University of Maryland. He served four years in the Navy, experiencing Europe as an airplane mechanic. He returned to his almost native Indian Head to work at the Naval Ordnance Station before serving as a logistics management specialist for the Naval Material Command, completing a 25 year career as a Navy civilian. He began a second career with Baldus Real Estate before retiring to begin a third career playing golf with his buddies. He loved traveling with his beloved wife of 49 years, Peggy. His son John shared Bob's love of cooking but trumped his father in fixing all his technical gadgets. He will be sorely missed.

Bob is the son of the late Martin Joseph Schaumburg and the late Margaret (O'Keefe) Schaumburg. He is also predeceased by his sister, Margaret Steinhauser. He is survived by his wife of 49 years, Peggy Ann (Milstead) Schaumburg and his son, John Michael Schaumburg and his companion, Cheryl Moulton.

There will be a gathering of family and friends on Friday, April 11, 2014 from 2PM until time of the Memorial Mass at 4PM at Sacred Heart Catholic Church, 201 St. Mary's Avenue, La Plata, MD 20646. Interment will be private.

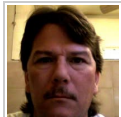
