Mr. Livers was a Custodian at La Plata High School with the Charles County Public Schools for 19 years and a member of St. Ignatius Chapel Point Catholic Church, Port Tobacco, MD. He was a veteran of the United States Army having served during World War II where he received the Good Conduct Medal, the European African Middle Eastern Services Ribbon, the American Theater Ribbon, and the World War II Victory Ribbon. In his earlier years, he enjoyed working on the family farm and was known as a “people person” especially with the students at La Plata High School.
